Four, Three, Two...

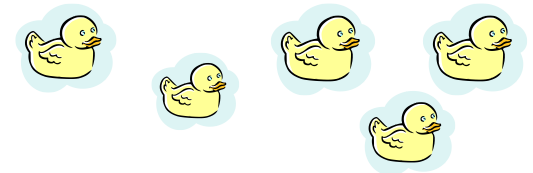
One little duck went out one day,
